Feedback is the lifeblood of a learning, growing community and it is no different at Kinma. The 2017 survey will soon be sent out. And we would love you to respond. Yes, it is shorter than last year (by 30%) and is still mostly closed ended questions to make it quick and easy, but also has open ended text boxes in case you have specific feedback that doesn't fit elsewhere.

For those of you with more than one child at Kinma, just fill it out multiple times, indicating which child it is each time. And if you are co-parenting your children with someone in a different household, it is possible (but not necessary) for each of you to fill in the survey about the same child.

We managed to bring water to the boil in a test tube using a creative set up to hold the test tube in position over the flame, while the kids took it in turns holding the thermometer bulb submersed in the top of the water (if we had let it sit in the test tube it absorbs the high heat from the flam and quickly bursts the thermometer!). While the water was slowly heating up, we tracked the temperature every two minutes in our data table.





We had a few grains of sand in the water to allow the bubbles to form more gently and we were so excited when it started to boil. We can't wait to graph the results!



and the search for the Ultimate Bubble Blowing mixture was explored by combining different amounts of baking powder, glycerine, dishwashing liquid and water.




Exact measurements were made and recorded in out lab notes.

Our fantastic periodic table is slowly take shape on the wall in the Testing Chamber too.


