As adults we know all too well the importance of good emotional health. When we are not connecting with people, or have a shorter fuse than normal we say and do things that seem to trouble our already troubled feelings.

This is no different for children and teenagers. They are learning at an incredibly exponential rate.

At Kinma we all strive to support emotional growth in everything that we do. That is why

RELATIONSHIP – is one of (if not the) the most important skill set we start with on the Kinma Journey.

Join us to get a few tips and share some of your expertise with us as well.

We will provide afternoon tea for the children while we chat in the hall.

Who is invited - Preschool and Primary parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles.

LABELLING CLOTHES

Could families please label all clothing and items which come to Kinma, including hats and shoes, bags and water bottles.

COOLER WEATHER

Children need to have layers of clothing for these cold mornings and beautiful sunny days. Shoes and socks, beanies along with long pants are what is needed to keep you warm, along with some good body movement and a hearty breakfast! We do not need air conditioning and warmed up areas to help promote the growth of germs! At Kinma we utilise air conditioning to take the chill off a space that has come from a long evening. Staff put air conditioners on in the morning as they get to school (8ish) and then off again by 9.15am. We



are not modelling correct behaviour if we support children wearing no shoes, no jumpers and then crank up the heat to make it toasty inside.

STANDARDISED TESTING

We have been watching the debate of NAPLAN and the roll out of Gonski II. At Kinma we have been teaching and learning with young students aged 3-12 years to for over 45 years in a progressive child-centred environment.

I invite you to come for a walk with me down a long and distant path that the School followed almost 20 years ago.

In 1999 (Kemp) the then Federal government instructed our school and a number of other schools that they would be required to commence testing students under the 'new basic skills test'. A small group of us (Currambena, Steiner, Montessori) headed to Canberra to meet with the Minister and his admin team to encourage their understanding of progressive and Steiner education and that we would be going against our Schools' Constitution (no competitive examinations). As you may imagine no luck, too difficult: one rule for all. We were also informed that any funding we received from the Government would be in jeopardy if we chose not to administer such exams. We left disillusioned.

However, after much discussion with the School Board and families and further discussions with the Administrative team in ACT we were reminded that within the Schools' Quadrennial Guidelines there was a passage that said "parents have choice "!!

On our return we gathered our families and administered one of the first compulsory tests in exam conditions. What did we see:

- nervous females
- agitated males
- one female crying
- one male needing to go to the bathroom
- several males laughing and expressing how they would come first

We stopped the test 2/3 through and spent the next three hours listening to how this made people feel, what did some of the questions really mean, and teachers explained the amount of time an educator would be required to take out of a school week for test prep. We were administering this test to adults! At the end of this forum all parents made the choice that they would remove their child from this form of testing.



We continue today in a healthy school environment not administering (one dimensional) standardised tests.

Does Kinma administer assessment tests? Does Kinma do pre and post testing? Does Kinma utilise SENA (maths) assessments? Does group 3 practice tests for preparation to high school? YES Purposeful tools that support an individual within a non threatening contextually environment.

What's Happening in Group 2 this Term?

Dear Group 2 parents, welcome to Term 2!

The cool autumn air has finally arrived, in both the playground and the classroom, and we are loving the feeling of the warming sun our backs at out times. Inside the classroom, the excitement has been building since last term when we explored possible theme-topics that the kids were interested in. During the first week of term the kids were shown a series of picture and word clues that hinted at the theme. In Week 2, they each used one of the school iPads to scan a QR code which revealed the Theme for Term 2. If you have the QR Reader on your phone or iPad feel free to check it out!



This took them to a website which told them:-

"After having discussed with you, your ideas...we found it really difficult to make a decision between 'Animals' and 'Sports'. So it's time for animal lovers and sports lovers to unite! Our theme is...

ANIMALS AND SPORT!


Over the course of this term, the class will create two magazines for the Kinma community. One will be about Animals and the other about Sport.

Your first task is to work in groups to look at magazines and put together a list of what is included in these types of magazines.

Some of the kids have chosen to focus just on sports or just on animals but many wish to contribute, written articles, puzzles, comics and/or images to both. Much of the work that we do in Group 2 during this term will be around understanding what different sections in magazines and other written publications are for and how to write them as well as researching and writing about topics that we are interested in.

There are four focus questions to help the kids work towards a range of learning goals this around this theme.

& of course a host of different teachers and family members in a variety of learning experiences.

Literacy

The children of Group 2 will learn some mad journalistic skills this term through reading, viewing and creating fictional and factual texts. They will create and be exposed to lots of different text types such as comic strips, persuasive articles, brain teasers and reviews. Learning about copyright and how to conduct objective research will also be a focus; a necessary skill in this Wikipedia age! Children will engage with these varied literacy learning experiences through independent activities, in small groups and as a whole class. Here are a few more details on how they will do this...

Shared Reading of a variety of magazine articles, information reports and other factual texts

We will be perusing and deconstructing a range of magazines and their elements as well as learning how to research, read and write sections for our own class magazines. Group 2 will become a hub for journalistic creation!

Guided Reading Groups- Book Club

Group 2 will work in small guided reading groups called Book Club 2-4 times per week. Children work in collaboration with their peers and a teacher to share and explore texts that are at the group's reading level and linked to the children's interests and passions. This term we will incorporate a range of magazine articles into these sessions. Reading strategies such as decoding, reading fluency, comprehension and concepts about print will be explicitly taught, learned and practised.



Weekly Writing

Because our theme this term is all about writing, we will immerse ourselves in the exciting world of language as written communication. Each week, we will move through a range of topics lead by the children's choices of what they'd like to contribute to our two class magazines on Animals and Sports. We will also look at writer's points of view, editing and how best to engage our audience!

Some ideas so far are crosswords, labelled diagrams, historical facts, book and film reviews, short stories and information reports! We hope to gain some great skills and put together informative, fun class publications.

Spelling Sessions

On a weekly basis, children and staff jointly select target spelling words as identified in children's writing and/or related to theme. In regular short, sharp (and fun) sessions, the children engage in hands-on and interactive spelling activities to practise the spelling of their target words. At the end of the week's cycle, children review words and peer and teacher feedback is provided. These spelling sessions enable the children to develop their vocabulary knowledge and gain confidence in their spelling capabilities and writing.

Number, Measurement, Data and Geometry

This term we're focusing on measurement, data and geometry as well as addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. After broadening our skills in these areas, we've got an exciting project in the pipeline for the children of Group 2 where they will get a chance to apply all of their new found knowledge and get their creative juices flowing. Let's just say we will be getting out amongst the beauty of Kinma and becoming familiar with our school grounds in ways we haven't before...more news about this soon!

Learning Support

Beatrice Heine will continue to work in the learning support role this term. She will be here on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and work with a range of Group 2 children providing Maths and English support.

Invitation to Parents

This term we'd like to continue our invitation to parents to come and spend some time in Group 2. Two preferred time slots for this are on Tuesday afternoon, after lunch and after morning Tea on Fridays. You may have something you want to share with the class, such as a story a song or an experience or you may just want to hang out. If you have any ideas, shoot us an email or catch us on the basketball court so we can plan with this in mind.

School Start Time

This is just a quick reminder that school begins at 9am and we'd like all children to be here before this time so we can begin our day together!

We're well into our learning in Group 2- more about this in our Term Two Overview


But thought it quite important to reflect on last term's adventures...

Most people in Group 2 listed Yurt Farm as among one of the most worthwhile activities from Term 1.




Lots of discussion of ensued about sample sizes and how conclusive our findings were considering we each only had five activities we could choose from, out of over 30!

With the arrival of some new carpets in Group 2 and some new tables on the way, we thought it only logical to discuss how we'd like to rearrange our room.












We all went to work to collaborate on some ideas and while we were at it, we also talked about how we work in groups. What does working in groups look like, sound like and feel like?



Here is what we came up with...




Bucket Filling in Group 2!



Beeswax Wrap Making Workshop

Beeswax wraps are a natural, reusable and completely biodegradable alternative to using plastic cling film in your kitchen or lunchbox - and they are beautiful too!

Waterproof yet breathable, beeswax wraps are great at keeping food fresh. Wraps can be used to wrap cheese, cut vegetables, avocados, loaves of bread and much more. They can be moulded to fit over the top of bowls of food in the fridge and are the perfect way to wrap a sandwich.

100% cotton fabric is infused with beeswax and tree resin, and coconut oil, a combination which has antibacterial and antimould properties, and which makes the wraps flexible and able to stick to themselves.

Learn to use, make and refresh your own beeswax wraps. You will make several wraps on the day to keep, but also learn how to easily do it yourself at home so you can so you can choose your own fabric and make as many as you like.

Beeswax wraps make the perfect gift for family, friends, and (best of all) for our planet!
