
# **Next Week - Surf Safe and Swimming**

The Triangle ..... The Heart ......

Some families will have no idea about what I am writing.

Others will have some vague recollections of a particular place that children are asked to play in at morning tea and lunch times if after breaking the trust between staff and themselves.

Hayley (mum of Turiee) will know, about the safe place in the centre of the School back in the 90's (we used to call it the heart) for when children chose repeatedly to ignore what staff asked of them; to keep them safe.

The place is central in the playground and children can be on the bricks outside the kitchen and groups 2/3.

This is the area that the staff sit during break periods. There is access to toilets, the kitchen and shade.

Kinma does not look to enforce punishment as a rule, but we do make it clear to children when the trust between the staff and the student has been broken. When this occurs discussion is had. Staff are incredibly tolerant and understanding. However, after repeated requests to honour the agreed play spaces, the call is made that the student will play in an area where they can be monitored by staff, kept safe and know that the trust relationship has broken.

Kinma does not have fences. We do not organise specific areas for children to play. We do not walk around at morning tea and lunch "checking' on your children; we trust them.

As a school, we do not find punishments "just because" - that is remote from the actions. Tidying the library, picking up papers or staying inside away from other students is not supporting a child's understanding of needing to keep them safe.

We have - respect yourself, respect others and respect the environment as our mantra. Students who choose to ignore the very few limits that we put in place at Kinma are not giving respect.

We are speaking with the children this term about trust and The Triangle and would love for you as family to open the conversation about how to keep children safe.




### **Preschool**

#### SKIPPER'S VISIT TO PRESCHOOL



## Term 4 Overview

Here we go for our final term together before wings are spread and the chickadees flee the nest!

In discussions with the children in term 3, we workshopped some ideas on themes and have landed on a perfect blend of drama and science. In order to accommodate both, we decided to create an airport where we can set forth to travel around the world to investigate the origin of scientific discoveries, as well as setting up the many shops they wish to role play as well. This is very exciting as there are so many rich opportunities to explore Creative arts, Maths, Literacy, Geography, History and Science, as well as the Social and Emotional aspects as the children collaborate toward some common goals.

The usual suspects in setting up dramatic play through shops are literacy

- Posters
- Brochures
- Menus
- Labels

#### and maths

- Money
- Quantities in recipes
- Charts and tables



In addition to these moments in play we will be focusing on particular skill sets in maths and literacy.

In literacy we will be delving into consonant digraphs (2 or more letters that come together to make one sound). The children love practising 'sh' as they put their finger to their lips and shoosh me! We will build on this by looking at sounds such as ch, wh, th etc. Through this we will build upon their bank of sight words as well as practice decoding words to read and encoding sounds to write.

In math we will continue looking at addition using larger numbers and begin to look at the difference between numbers through subtraction. They will also be heading back to work and using their Gerald and Piggie dollars to spend at the many stores within the airport. We are bringing cheques back!

We will of course be flying around the world and try to visit many different cultures, providing them with lots of arts, crafts and foods of different nations.



### Other bits and bobs

Book Boxes remains on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Balls and hoops is how we start our Tuesday and Thursday mornings. We are introducing some more group games during this time so be sure to get here in time!

Swimming will be happening from chapter 2 this term (week 2) each Tuesday. Children must be picked up from the swim centre, promptly at 3pm. Please remember to include a towel, swimmers, a swim cap and goggles in a comfortable bag for them to carry. Also a water bottle is a must for these walks.

Transition will begin in Week 6 where the children will head to Group 1 for 2 sessions a week with Michelle and Tom.

Please ensure your children have a hat, a water bottle and a change of clothes in their bag each day. As the weather gets warmer there is the opportunity for water play so long as they have spare clothes. The children must wear a hat during out times otherwise they will be asked to play undercover.

If you have any toy tools we could use them for our mechanic shop.

### Group 3 Overview, Term 4

'Welcome to Wonderland!'

'What an idea. A crazy, mad, wonderful idea'.

Alice (Alice in Wonderland)

It's down the rabbit hole through to wonderland we go- with our play, 'Alice in Wonderland' just around the corner what better metaphor to explore?!



With 'Wonderland' as our theme for the term, Group 3 children have chosen lots of different paths down which to wander into their own Wonderland. Ghostly, mythological and mysterious worlds- just waiting to be explored!

Lewis Carroll's Wonderland will be at the forefront of everyone's minds as we immerse ourselves in rehearsals, costume creation and making of props for the first few weeks of this term. We are busy learning our lines and working out just how loud our voice needs to be so our audience can hear us.

Alongside these very practical things, we will look at the artistry and skill development required to stage a theatrical production such as characterisation, voice projection and stagecraft.

Combining, creative arts, literacy and technological skills, children have suggested that we create miniature sets for different characters and make stop motion animations based on original stories written by the kids.

We are continuing to read 'Parvana's Journey' by Deborah Ellis as our class novel with the hope of finishing it in the next few weeks. Once it's complete, we will select and vote on something new - we are open to suggestions so please let us know if you have any books you think would fit into our theme of 'Wonderland!'

In maths we will delve deeper into fractions and decimals, whole number, patterns and algebra and continued consolidation of the four operations-

addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Group 3 children will engage in whole class and small group maths learning and the focus of our Thursday time slot for maths will focus on maths puzzles, investigations and problem solving.



### Friendship Seed Day

Ask anyone and they will concur that our own Group 3 Wonderland is built on Friendship! The annual tradition of Friendship Seed Day is coming up on Wednesday 23rd October. We have around 70 friends from other schools joining us for friendship band making, games, drama and other creative and sporty activities. We are currently donning our organisational hats and are in the midst of planning how the day will run


