Kinma Pop-Up Bazaar Fri 25th Nov

Last Friday saw the Kinma community and friends come together for its third Pop-Up Bazaar. The weather was kind and great efforts to sell and consume were made by all.

15 tables were set up by volunteer parents and staff, filling the hall for an afternoon. Honey and aromatherapy oil products as well as handmade cards and toys were sold alongside pre-loved clothing, accessories, books, toys and kitchenware. Freecycle at the bazaar saw a table of free items offered for the first time. There was a cheerful buzz in the hall as all perused the fineries on offer and some gorgeous bargains were snapped up. We appreciate the efforts involved in sourcing, sorting, transporting and them removing unsold items.

Tattoos, guess the sweets and nail polish stalls were administered by Kinma children with much enthusiasm. The children were also enthusiastic in their spending, bringing pocket money and being bankrolled by the adults present. Parents who weren't at pick up helped provide bags of gold for young customers and the kids' sunny energy permeated the afternoon.

A café of donated deliciousness served afternoon tea and coffee with homemade cakes, slices, muffins, cookies, blissballs, vegetarian pakora, sausage rolls, cheese pastries, banana loaf and watermelon. Almost 100 schmooze were consumed with gusto.

A highly anticipated raffle ended the event with excitement at the list of prizes on offer. We are grateful to the many local businesses who gave generously towards individual prizes and to parents, staff, families and friends who gave gifts for the hamper plus their efforts to sell/buy tickets in the past few weeks.

The money raised at the Bazaar will be divided between pre-school and primary fundraising projects and is testament to everyone's participation as seller, buyer, donater, funder, helper, poster/signage-maker, raffler, table organiser, goods delivery driver or cafe baker and often as many of these things.

Group 1 News

We have welcomed Sigrid, Ewan, Poppy, Nate, Lenny, Olive and Samara from preschool, as well as Zadie's sister Willow for some Christmas craft transition. Group 1 are busy little bees preparing for the upcoming markets so get ready to see a cacophony of creations with a festive flair! It's lovely to see the children helping each other out, teaching how to make pop-up cards, pom poms and friendship bands. It's a great opportunity for many to work with different children other than their immediate friends and a chance for all to make our guests feel welcome.

Group one have had their thinking caps on for our maths experiences recently, and are busy preparing the same challenges for Mums and Dads. They were challenged as to how they could start the rocket with a triangular keypad of numbers 1 to 6, where each side added up to 9. It's harder than you may think but with a lot of persistence they were able to move around all the numbers to fit. They even configured them to add up to 10, 11 and 12!



Eating this challenge up, they then moved to arranging dominoes into a square, trying to get the same number (12) on each side.







Stopping for a breath, they then jumped into making a 3×3 grid of the numbers 1 to 9 and organising them so that each column, each row and each diagonal added to 15!

The children have also been polishing off their newspapers which will become their report to go home. Set in a newspaper format, the children have selected various articles and samples of their experiences to go home which should make for some exciting holiday reading.

As we speed through to the end of term we have the Christmas markets, our group 1 end of year farewell and the pre-high concert to look forward to. In Group 1 we will be saying goodbye to Kayden, Aleena, Harry and Leon. We wish all their families the best in their exciting new adventures.
