GROUP 2's TERM 4 ADVENTURES!

Dear Group 2 parents, welcome to Term 4!

Goodness it's almost the end of the year...the weather is getting warmer and calls of 'where is your hat?' are echoing across Kinma grounds. There is a lot happening inside and outside the classroom this term and we'd better hold on to our hats because it will be the end of the year before we know it!

Here is a short overview of the learning happening in Group 2 in Term 4.

& of course a host of different teachers and family members in a variety of learning experiences.

Theme: First Contacts (History, English, Geography, Creative Arts)

This term Group 2 will explore a unit on Indigenous Australian cultures, including learning about local Aboriginal heritage and culture of the Gai-marigal peoples. We will investigate the rich and diverse culture, experience, perspectives and significant contributions of Aboriginal peoples, past and present. We hope to explore interactions between Aboriginal peoples and their first contacts with Europeans. Examining the historical, current and future consequences of this contact will be a focus. We will integrate literacy learning experiences throughout the unit in the form of journal and recount writing, investigation of Aboriginal Australian Song Lines and immersion in stories of the Dreamtime. Children will also learn some of the basic skills related to historical inquiry.

Creative Arts (i.e. song and movement, making and art theory), bush craft, Science and Technology (i.e. designing and making shelters) and geography content will also be woven into our theme related work.

Throughout this unit, we hope to provide authentic learning experiences for the children as we engage in and explore our rich Aboriginal histories and cultures, in consultation with local Indigenous community members. As teachers at Kinma, we encourage the children to critically think about historical events and differing perspectives. It is our responsibility to exercise flexibility and an open mind in our planning and programming to cater for this emergent and ever-changing curriculum. Such an approach, allows us to honour, address and investigate the children's interests and curiosities more deeply as they arise.



Side Note- The Time Machine: BC1-6Q

Our thematic journeys through time will occur aboard the BC1-6Q which has been re-constructed by Group 2. Latitudes and Longitudes as well as dates and times of certain events throughout history provide us with the coordinates to travel to a particular time and place. Speak to your Group 2ers about this marvellous invention!

Literacy

Literacy takes many shapes in Group 2. This term we will be looking at a range of texts including film, song, dance and performance.

Children will engage with these varied literacy learning experiences through independent activities, in small groups and as a whole class. Here are a few more details on how they will do this...

Independent Reading

Group 2 students have a chance to 'Be Read' or *BRead* as this precious time is affectionately called 2-4 times per week. During these half hour sessions, we aim for full immersion into imaginative worlds through reading independently. For many this is a meditative time where they can really get into a book purely for the love of reading.

Guided Reading Groups- Book Club

As is a consistent practise in Group 2, we will work in small guided reading groups called Book Club 2-4 times per week. Children work in collaboration with their peers and a teacher to share and explore texts that are at the group's reading level and linked to the children's interests and passions. Texts range from Reader's Theatre plays to chapter books to poetry and beyond. Reading strategies such as decoding, reading fluency, comprehension and concepts about print will be explicitly taught, learned and practised. This term much of the reading material used this term will be based on our theme. During this time, children may also read one on one with teachers.

Whole Class Shared Reading of Texts

As a class students will engage with several theme-related texts this term. We will all sit around the metaphorical campfire and listen to stories of Dreamtime from all over Australia, as well as short stories and poems that give us an insight into the rich culture of our First Australians.

Spelling Sessions

Our spelling program this term will emulate the structure that we followed in Term 3 whereby children and staff jointly select target spelling words as identified in children's writing and/or related to our theme. In regular short, sharp (and fun) sessions, the children engage in hands-on and interactive spelling activities to practise the spelling of their target words

At the end of the week's cycle, children review words and peer and teacher feedback is provided. These spelling sessions enable the children to develop their vocabulary knowledge and gain confidence in their spelling capabilities and writing.



Numeracy

During Nuzzles (number puzzles) this term we will be looking at Number, Measurement and Geometry, in particular Place Value, Decimals, Fractions, 2D & 3D Space, Volume and Mass. We have started working with fractions and decimals, angles, time and 2 Dimensional shapes. Each week, on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays students work in small groups with Bea, Deepika or Tristan and on Wednesdays we work on different topics with the whole class.

Please discuss the topics that we are covering in class and consider sharing activities at home that might support their learning, such as using weights and measure when cooking at home (Volume and Mass), building with Lego or similar, art or construction with natural materials (2D and 3D Space) or simply getting them to do calculations with money in shops or at home to support their understanding of decimals. The more contact they have with the ideas and the ways that they are used in real life the more they will value the concept ...and their understanding will be richer for it.

Social Emotional Learning

Explicit Social-Emotional learning sessions will continue to take place in Group 2 this term. Following on from the Kindness Boomerang in in Term 3, we are looking at Empathy over the next few weeks. Characters from literature are helping us to put ourselves in other people's shoes. Self-Reflection, Self-Regulation and kindness will be also be discussed in detail.

Learning Support Beatrice Heine will continue to work in the learning support role this term. She will be here on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and work with a range of Group 2 children providing Maths and English support.

Invitation to Parents

This term we'd like to continue to encourage families to come and spend time in Group 2. Term 4 we have Swimming on Tuesday afternoons, but Fridays work well. You may have something you want to share with the class, such as a story a song or an experience or you may just want to hang out. If you have any ideas, shoot us an email or catch us on the basketball court so we can plan with this in mind. Also, if Fridays don't work for you, let us know and I'm sure we can find a time.

Please get in touch if you wish to have a chat about your child's world at school.


All our produce is certified organic and locally sourced. Most our leafy greens are paddock to plate in 24hours grown for us down south in Camden and Picton.

All orders will be packed and delivered to Kinma on a Tuesday in time for school pick up for families to take home.

Families will need to make a note at checkout when ordering that they are a Kinma family so we can make note of who is who. Please use the word 'KINMA' at checkout in the notes.

All orders must be placed by 9PM Friday to ensure they don't miss out.. Usually we can still fit them in if they come after this time however things like sourdough need at least 48hours to prep and meat boxes a little longer to organise."
