# **Group 2**

Welcome to Group 2's newsletter. First we will tell you about the theme, then we will talk about maths and last but not least literacy. In each section we will explain about what we have been doing. We hope enjoy you it!



Furthering our exploration of our Botany theme, Group 2 have made succulent gardens and we planted them in our broken pots (if you don't know about that, look at week two's newsletter). We have just gotten our baby orchids. They are Cymbidiums. We water them on Wednesdays so we call it Watering Wednesdays.



# KIMMa

We made a field guide about them so we know how to care for them. The orchids are little but in 1-2 years they will get flowers. We also got a tiny seed which is germinating and has sprouted – it is a surprise about what vegetable it will grow into!





rats, insects and birds.

We do Etchy Sketchy which is where we learn how to sketch and draw different plants. So far we've drawn leaves, our baby orchids and a hibiscus flower. We also learnt about the parts of flowers. We had daffodils and jonquils and studied them – and found eggs inside! We learnt about how pollination happens and that the purpose of a flower is to pollinate other flowers so the seeds develop and new plants can grow. Plus they feed bats, geckos, bush









In math's Kimberley's group has been using split strategy (where you break numbers into smaller part and add them together again like 421+153 = 400+100, 20+50 and 1+3 = 574) and compensation strategy (where if you have to add a 9, you change it to a 10 and takeaway 1 like 532+19 = 532+10-1 = 541).

NOD: nod is where there is a number, for example 80. So what I would do is write down as many equations as I can that will equal 80. They can be addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.


Number pyramid: this is where you draw a pyramid that has 4 squares and the bottom, then three, then two and one. Once you have done that you write down four numbers in the four boxes, you add two together and write them in the box above and keep on going adding up all the boxes.



In literacy the teachers put us into two different groups and each group chose their own name. The groups names are: the unicorns and Vroom vroom very fast car. In the unicorns we have been writing about plants. This is to practice our handwriting and learn about plants, the most recent ones are Rafflesias, Venus fly trap and the Pitcher plant.

After we have written about whichever plant we are doing,

we do prefixes. We are given the beginning of words, for example sept, and we are told it means seven. Then we will come up with words which have that meaning, like septet. We get four prefixes and we have to find 3 examples of each.

After prefixes we get to do free writing in our literacy books. It can be anything such as poems, song writing, a kind notes for a friend or story writing. We have also learnt about synonyms, antonyms and apostrophes.

In Vroom vroom very fast car they have been working on writing a story quest. They also do an activity where they get a picture for example a cat chasing a dog chasing a mouse and they would say what they think the cat or the mouse is saying. The cat might say,

"Almost got you, dinner!"








