


Preschool

Group 4


It has been a busy couple of weeks for Group 4 as we have settled back into the flow of things and had all members of the team back together. It has been beautiful to witness connections and friendships being rekindled.

Reconciliation week recognition and exploration

Since our last newsletter, we recognised and explored Reconciliation week, with this year's theme being "In This Together". It has been a great opportunity to further explore elements of the culture and ways of being of our First Nation's people. This is something we already try to embed wherever possible in Group 4, but it was exciting to focus on exploring various texts from Indigenous authors and experiment with storytelling through symbols and art, furthering Group 4's ability to take on authorship roles!











Group 4 loved furthering our knowledge and use of the local Guringai language, branching out from our version of Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes to also learning our numbers 1-6 in local Guringai language



One particular text that we have all loved exploring has been, "My Kind" written by AFL star Eddie Betts, which celebrates the power and positivity that can be created when we all come together and spread kindness. It explores rhyme and rap and has been so fun to explore together as a group...

Going bush!

More recently, Group 4 has been exploring everything that the natural world around us has to offer. This has meant building teepees outside, bushcraft and exploring many new bushwalk tracks thanks to the collective Kinma knowledge. During these bush exploration sessions we explore and experiment with nature sounds and animal calls, practise survival skills, such as saving people with ropes, sink/float experiments, floating creek races and much more!

The Creature River created was a Lava monster. Each colour on his monster gives it a power to help it survive on this very hostile planet.

























Planet weather game

Mona Vale Road East - Out of hours work

Out of hours work is planned from 8pm to 5am on the following dates, weather permitting:

- Tuesday 16, Wednesday 17 and Friday 19 June
- Tuesday 23, Wednesday 24 and Friday 26 June
 If work is delayed due to wet weather, we will try and work a different night within seven days. We will notify highly impacted residents if there is a change of date.

To minimise the impact of night work on residents, we do not work for more than two consecutive nights in the same area and will work only 10 days within the same month. If you are eligible for Alternative Accommodation you will be advised within 24 hours of the work.

Work along the eastern end of the project includes:

- using a vacuum truck and an excavator to trench and install utilities under the Mona Vale Road, Samuel Street and Ponderosa Parade roundabout
- saw cutting to remove the concrete footpath from the eastern side of Samuel Street and replace it with a temporary footpath (for future utility relocation work)
- a vacuum truck and backhoe to excavate and confirm the location of services under Samuel Street
- ongoing road maintenance.

Work along the western end of the project includes:

- removing rock from the top of the existing rock cuttings near our site compound (opposite 120 Mona Vale Road), the eastern end of Lane Cove Road and near Laurel Road
- installing screens and relocating concrete barriers on Mona Vale Road near Laurel Road and the eastern end of Lane Cove Road
- ongoing road maintenance.

We will use excavators with rock hammers, backhoes, tipper trucks, elevated work platforms, hammer drills, a roller, saw cutters, street sweepers, a concrete truck, vacuum trucks, wacker packers, light vehicles and lighting towers. A stop/slow arrangement will be in place with traffic controllers and signage directing traffic.
